CHEVROLET HIGHLIGHTS THROUGH THE YEARS

1911 - Chevrolet Motor Company was formed.

1912 - Chevrolet hits the streets of Detroit with the "classic six." 1914 - The Chevy "bowtie" logo appeared for the 1st time. The

first Chevrolet to feature the valve-in-engine design.

1918 - Chevrolet joined GM Corporation. First Chevy truck was sold.

1923 - Chevy built its 1 millionth car. Established 1st export assembly plant in Denmark.

1929 - Chevy introduced its first 6-cylinder engine.

1930 - The 7 millionth Chevy is produced. Chevy was the first to introduce articulated brake shoes, giving more positive braking action.

1933 - New Chevy "firsts" were introduced including: vacuum spark control, manifold heat control, and no-draft ventilation.

1934 - Chevy introduced independent front suspension. 1950 - "Powerglide" is the 1st automotive transmission in the low-price field.

1953 - Corvette was introduced featuring the industry's 1st production fiberglass body.

1955 - The legendary small block Chevy V8 engine was introduced.

- 1979 The 100 millionth Chevrolet was built.
- 1996 Chevy introduced the Vortec engine.

2011 - Chevrolet Volt - an extended range electric vehicle is the 2011 Motor Trend Car of the Year!

Limited Production 1969 Chevrolet Z-10 Camaro Makes a Stop at Spring Food Lion AutoFair

Z-10 Camaros were somewhat unknown until the mid-1980s, when a few enthusiasts started questioning why a very few Camaros came with "Z-10" stamped on the cowl tag. The more plentiful Z-28s and even the Z-11 convertible Indy 500 pace cars had well known plate codes, and were easily identified. But the limited production Z-10 lacked the documentation and advertisement cam-





stripes, all are equipped with the Rally Sport and Super Sport option packages, and all came from the factory with a cowl induction hood, rear spoiler and rally wheels.

Dan Herzberg purchased this particular Z-10 in 2004 from Texas, where it had been sitting in a garage for almost 20 years. Over a 3 year period he totally disassembled the car, had it media blasted and repainted in original colors, and reassembled the car restoring each component as the project progressed. The car was restored with originality as highest priority. Dan's Z-10 was finished in November 2010 and currently shows 400 miles on the odometer.
